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## Message from the Plant Chair **Jeff Papoff**

Hello Sisters, Brothers and Siblings,

It's been a busy few months, and it's great to back in the plant after a successful round of Bargaining! In April, we headed out to prepare for negotiations. Our Bargaining Committee spent the first 6 weeks in a windowless room, with the walls getting closer and closer by the minute. I appreciate the dedication and perseverance of the team as we went through the surveys and scrutinized the contract looking for areas that needed improvement. We had some long days, but I believe the preparation was worth it. When it was time to start meeting with the Company, the Committee moved into a smaller space but at least gained some windows, and the long days were joined by some late nights. Stress levels went up and discussions gained intensity, but we managed to maintain our focus throughout the process.

Our members made it very clear that they would not stand for a repeat of 2018. Despite the Company's reminders that the last contract was ratified by 66% at the time, we knew the membership had spent the past 5 years growing more bitter and angry with every passing day.

We had a lot of ground to make up, and your Bargaining Committee was determined to do things differently this time. The preparation started a couple years ago, but really ramped up in the 13 months leading up to ratification. By reaching out to the Membership, and listening to the feedback we received, we had a pretty good understanding of what it would take to put the ugliness of 2018 behind us.

In the end, our members stood strong, and gave us a 99% Strike Mandate – the power to strike if needed to get what we deserved. Over 100 of our siblings volunteered to be Strike Captains and Strike Committee members, making themselves available for whatever was required of them. We had support at all levels of our National Union, from local Staff Rep Frank Wright to Western Regional Director Gavin McGarrigle, to Assistant to the National President Shane Wark, right up to National President Lana Payne. They (and many others within the organization) offered up anything and everything we needed to get the job done. While a strike was ultimately avoided, we were fully prepared to act. The display of Solidarity we witnessed from all levels of our Union throughout all stages of this experience was truly inspiring.

On a local level, the entire process leading up to this contract was a group effort in the greatest sense of the term. There were a lot of key players who made this round of Bargaining happen. From the Shop Committee to the Executive, to the Elections Committee and the Standing Committees. Many rank-and-file volunteers, everyone who attended the various meetings and Town Halls. Everyone who filled out a survey, and who came to a monthly General Membership Meeting. Everyone who wore a Bargaining T-shirt and who joined in the "LTD Not on Me" chanting. Countless people putting in countless hours, much of it on their own time. I am grateful for all the effort that everyone put into making this contract a success.

We can't stop now, however. Our Local needs to keep moving forward. Our current contract will expire in approximately 34 months, meaning the preparation starts now. There is no time to sit back and wait. We have already begun planning for the next one, gathering information and working on strategies for 2026.

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We've discussed doing more Zone-Specific Discussions going forward. Stay tuned for more info on the next round and sign up for an opportunity. We want to continue keeping the Membership informed and educated, and we always want to hear feedback from you!

We're in the proofreading stage of the new CBA and expect to have the books printed soon to be distributed in early September. Once you get your copy, please read through it and understand the changes.

For those that don't know yet, Brian Corrigal has stepped away from his role as Zone 1 (Assembly) Rep in order to start the next phase of his career as a Tooling Technician. I want to thank Brian for all his hard work and dedication. Brian truly cares about the membership, and he has been an integral part of this Shop Committee. It's been great working with Brian, and I wish him all the best in his new position. I have a feeling we haven't seen the last of this guy!

There will be an election on August 23rd to elect a full time Assembly Rep. In the meantime, Devon Morgan is filling in admirably. Devon has many years of experience as an Alternate, so the learning curve has been small. Please help me welcome Devon in the interim, and if you are in Zone 1, don't forget to vote on August 23rd!

For Mr. Santos, it's not necessarily a farewell. More like "see ya soon". Although we won't be working together every day, Chris will always be a member of Local 2169. Chris has left his mark on this local in so many ways, and I know that most of us will continue to ask the question "What would Santos do?" when presented with a challenging situation. On a personal level, I don't think either one of us would have guessed how close we would become. Although we didn't agree on absolutely everything, we respect each other's viewpoints and work well together. Like an old married couple, we eventually got to the point where we were finishing each other's thoughts and sentences. Chris and I could always trust each other to have each other's back, and to have the best interests of Unifor and Local 2169 in mind. I owe him a great deal of gratitude for the support he gave me along the way and for making things run as smoothly as possible. Chris has an intense passion for this Union, and a desire to make things better for everyone within it. I know that he will succeed in his new role. I wish Chris nothing but the best in everything he encounters along the way.
